THE EASTERN PA SCHOLARSHIP ADVISORY BOARD HAS ENDORSED THE FOLLOWING: IF A FAMILY HAS NOT PAID THEIR PAST TUITION BILL (2023-2024) THEY WILL **NOT BE** ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE AN EITC/OSTC SCHOLARSHIP FROM THE EASTERN PENNSYLVANIA SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION.

It is the responsibility of each family to make sure that their tuition is paid in full each year. Failure to do so will make the family ineligible to receive an EPSF Scholarship.

Class of 2025 Information

In the coming month, students should start thinking of schools they will want to apply to and determine if those schools require SAT/ ACT scores. Seniors are encouraged to visit schools over the summer break, each Senior will only receive 3 excused college visits, utilizing summer break is imperative!

FINAL TRANSCRIPTS: Unofficial copies will be available, upon request, for athletic recruitment or to begin the application process. If you are applying to a school that id D1 or D2, please contact me for information on getting enrolled in the NCAA portal.

RECOMMENDATION LETTERS*: If you have not already done so- please reach out now to ask for recommendations from those you want to write your letters for you. Provide them with a complete resume- Template on Google Classroom. *You do not need to know where you are applying to ask for letters*. If they say "Yes": Follow up with your writers when you return to school! **Before Aug 1, remember to ask: 2 Teachers. 1 Counselor. 1 Supplemental (coach, employer, clergy, etc.)** You should submit your recommendation letter request for me here: https://forms.gle/vdL5Dmv6hcEyzR1t6, there is a spot for you to upload your resume in the google form.

COMMON APPLICATION: We ask that all students apply to schools through "Common App", and while the Common Application won't allow submission of applications until after August 1- late June - early July is a GREAT TIME to create an account and begin populating the general application form. Go to www.commonapp.org to create an account and begin the process. Here is your Common App Cheat Sheet to help you with completing your profile.

COMPLETE SUMMER ASSIGNMENTS There is a direct correlation between academic performance. and working in stages vs cramming. Chip away at assignments throughout the Summer. DO NOT PROCRASTINATE! Start working on your Common App essays now to have them ready when you get back to school to work on with your English teachers.

GRADUATION PLANNING MEETINGS: All Seniors are required to meet with Mrs. Brensinger before September 15th to discuss their post-graduation plans. Important Notes for the 2024-2025 school year

The PSAT will once again take place in October, all students in 9 through 11 will be required to take the test.

<u>Test Accommodations</u> through College Board for the PSAT and SAT are available Please contact Mrs. Brensinger in Guidance if you have a Classroom Plan in place and are looking for accommodations for the PSAT or SAT. **This is a 7-week process at minimum**, parents are encouraged to reach out immediately. The ASVAB- all Seniors will complete the ASVAB test in October as we have in years past.
